Interpretation of function and purpose

Frida Kahlo

- **Birthdate** : July 6, 1907

- Birth place : Coyoacan, Mexico City, Mexico

- **Death date** : July 13, 1954

- **Type of artist**: Added Mexican tradition with Surrealist renderings to her art

 Mexican female artist who became famous for the details explored in her self-portraits and symbolic patterns within her paintings of the traumatic events that occurred to her

Frida Kahlo painted small, personal paintings about her surroundings and life experiences. The majority of her art work consisted of herself and her love experiences. Kahlo was considered a Surrealist painter but she never considered herself one. Her paintings contained a vast of imagination and concepts that would tie with Surrealism but her mind never found herself part of the art movement. Her art created questioning and curiosity within the audience because of the value and balance being explored.



Interpretation of function and purpose

The majority of Kahlo's artwork was explicit and included the impact on people of wanting to know more about her art pieces and meanings behind them. Many of her master pieces were about her own self. Her self portraits reflected her inner and external pain and sexuality. Her appearance was well known and exposed. She wore colorful traditional Mexican dresses that made her stand out but most definitely her unique unibrow. Also she was known for the vibrant colors utilized in her paintings, which were influenced by her Indigenous culture in Mexico. Not only was she influenced by her hometown, Mexico but as well as Europe with symbolism and Realism. She developed her personality in her art work with the color, value, and emphasis of her persona within a canvas. Her gentle brushstrokes formulated the harmony or chaos that Kahlo wanted to convey within her art.

Frida's quotes have become popular around the world as time has advanced. They consist of deepness and emotion, just like her art. They reveal Frida's real life and her reflection on own herself. The quotes can be used to gain inspiration in art itself or life in general. With Frida's quotes it can be observed the type of artist she was. With her sayings, the deepness in her art is reflected. Her art work developed dark colors and contrast.

Analysis of formal qualities

Frida, being a young artist, decided to approach Diego Rivera, the most famous Mexican muralist, for advice on her decision of pursuing art as her future career. Since Rivera had quite an experience with art, he quickly recognized her talent and uniqueness in her masterpieces. He encouraged her to become an artist as soon as possible because she had a strong talent in the field. Diego had an admiration for women with a passion.

Not so far into Frida's career, she and Rivera dated. Diego Rivera was much older than her, he was twenty years older. She had a vast appreciation for him, that she decided to marry him. Frida Kahlo and Diego Rivera married each other in 1929. Frida's mother did not approve of this relationship due to the age difference. They both were well known for the nickname, "The Elephant and the Dove" referring to their size difference. Through this marriage she suffered a lot of emotional pain due to her husband's infidelities. He had the fame of not being a settled man. Even through the bad memories he made her go

through she loved him. This is all relevant and reflected in her art, what she lived she would paint. She was said, "I don't paint dreams or nightmares, I paint my own reality" With this being said, it was definite that her life was her biggest inspiration in her art.

Frida never really lived a happy life. Ever since she was little she suffered. At the age of eight, she contained polio which affected her immune system later on in her life. She suffered from a few miscarriages during her marriage. Diego was not a loyal husband, he even cheated on Frida with her sister Cristina. Some of her artwork was formulated by these events in her life.

- Type of artist: Visual Art artist and illustrator
- **School she attended:** Received her BFA from the Peck School of the Arts in the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee



I came across Kat Rodriguez on spring of 2016 at a gallery night in downtown Milwaukee. Her abstract series of paintings caught my attention right away. I had never seen any type of painting like hers. She explained that her series connects to her pain of migraines which has a huge connection to Frida since she also painted her pain.

Interpretation of function and purpose


Influences




-Title of the piece : Dark Abyss

-Created to portray curiosity in to the audience and for them to create their own meaning of the piece



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
Comparing Artists





This painting caught my attention on how the dark colors are being manipulated. When looking at it, it created peace within me because of its flow and lines.







My Artwork

Name of piece : Reality



A piece inspired the local artist, Kat Rodriguez. With the use of watercolor I wanted to show the movements of thoughts in the mind of one. The piece shows half a face with dark splashes in the inside and colorful vibrant splashes in the outside.





The meaning behind this piece is simple and real. As we see in the second paper, there half of face painted. The face represents the human being. To the right (the inside of the human) dark colors are painted with a sensation of drops. Towards the left the colors being utilize changed completely since they are bright and colorful. This simply reflects that as much light and happiness are shown there's always someone who does not change. Their inside is too dark to actually see what's further of them. That is one way to interpret the piece, while the second interpretation includes: as much as a person is sad and depressed in the inside they will never reflect their true feelings. They say that the happiest people are the ones to have the worst life. The outside is colorful and all but what we don't know are the real colors inside. It's up to the audience to flow their mind and come up with their own meaning.

Making comparisons and connections Similarities Differences

- * With *Reality* I decided to use the same material, watercolor, as the local artist being investigated in this comparative study, Kat Rodriguez.
- * The meaning behind this piece is simple. I demonstrate how the human mind works. The mind of someone who is upset and blue in the inside but on the outside portrays otherwise. Kat's watercolor works reflect her personal illness of migraines. I went further than better with this piece since Kat does the same with her meanings.
- * Watercolor swatches are soft and dark in particular areas. Manipulating the watercolor is part of the meaning since sometimes we manipulate our mind with trying to ignore who we are.

- * I don't have a background color like Kat creates with all of her work.
- * Kat's work includes a vast variety of shapes, I only have wavy lines and splashes while she includes circles, wavy lines, straight lines, and unique shapes.
- * Kat either uses dark colors or hot colors for each piece, I developed both of them in one painting.
- * My brushstrokes go with the flow of the water while Kat's work demonstrates that she is very precise with each and one of her brushstrokes

Conclusion

In conclusion, all the artworks utilize a variety of hues to make the painting stand out. Kat Rodriguez uses a more gentle brush stroke and flowy. On the contrary, Frida Kahlo was more detailed with her paintings and meanings behind her artworks. The mediums are different as well, since Frida used acrylic on canvas while Kat uses watercolor and ink. Two total different mediums that portray a different effect. At the end, the materials all contribute to the meaning of the piece. Both artists based their paintings on personal pain and events in their lives. Frida and Kat both reflect that pain can bloom a positivity in a way or another, such as their talent and fame.
